Her articles "Israel's Baby: The Horror of Childbirth in the Biblical Prophets" and "The Monstrous Feminine in the Book of Jeremiah" appeared in *Biblical Interpretation* and *Lectio Difficilior*. She also contributed to *The Torah: A Woman's Commentary* and her book *Terror All Around: Horror, Monsters and Theology* appeared in 2008. Currently, she is working on a book entitled *Sister to Sister: The Literary Representation of Sisters in the Hebrew Bible*.
