Dear Rabbi Claman,

From all the days in the year to honor pillars of the Ahavas Shalom Congregation, tonight is surely the most fitting, as we begin reading this week's Torah portion of Re'eh, in which it focuses on the establishment of a central place of worship for the Jewish people, describing how Hashem "will choose to have His name dwell" in one particular place and there, they were commanded to "celebrate before Hashem." The verse is referring to the Temple in Jerusalem, the place where Hashem's presence was most revealed.

Now Hashem is everywhere. There is not a place in this world where He is not present. Why then must His worship be centralized? Why can't we serve Him anywhere and everywhere?

Hashem wanted man to have one place where he could sense the spiritual, where he would be uplifted above material concerns.
