Yehudah ben Teima taught: There are varied milestones in a person's life. With every age, from our youngest years to our most mature, there are goals and there are accomplishments. While people mature at different rates, there are certain markers that are typically achieved. So Yehuda ben Teima explains: Five years old for the study of Torah; Ten for the study of Mishnah; Thirteen is the age for observing the *mitzvot*. He continues and teaches that at age sixty a person reaches maturity and seventy is the age of true seniority. (Pirkei Avot 5:20)

It is difficult to imagine that these same standards can be applied to a nation. It still feels as though Israel, at age 70, is in its infancy. Yet every accomplishment, whether it be in technology, agriculture, economics, art or science, speaks to a nation that has reached its maturity.
