Dear Friends,

What better way to honor Cantor Janet Leuchter than through song? *Eshet Chayl*, a song traditionally sung on Friday night before the Shabbat meal, comes from the Book of Proverbs (Chapter 31: 10-31). Eshet Chayl is translated as "Woman of Valor" where each of the 21 stanzas attributes a different quality to women; specifically, stanza 26 "*She opens her mouth with wisdom, and teaching of kindness is upon her tongue*" clearly defines Cantor Janet Leuchter for me.

The wisdom, concern, and kindheartedness that she has exhibited over these past ten years is notable. Whether it is working with a fearful child during B'nei Mitzvah Training, entering a Religious School classroom or merely walking the room during Kiddush on Shabbat afternoons, her kindness is conveyed to all.
