### TOWN BUILDING REPORT MADE BY LANDER

#### New Construction Totalling \$69,350 Authorized In Town

New construction of \$69,350 was authorized in unincorporated Greenburgh during January according to the monthly report of Building Inspector Walter M. Lander filed on Tuesday with the Town Council.

### NEW BUILDING SITE BOUGHT BY CHURCH

#### Mrs. Bertollette Sells Broadway Parcel To First Church Of Christ

The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Dobbs Ferry, has acquired a new building site on North Broadway in this village and has petitioned the Town of Greenburgh Council for tax-exemption on same.

The application, read at Tuesday's council meeting by Town Clerk William VanDorn, was referred to the real estate committee of which Council E. Wilbur McDowell is chairman, by Supervisor William C. Duell, who presided.

The petition set forth that the church has decided that its original building site on Eldridge Place—opposite Sussex Hall apartments on Broadway—is not topographically suited for building and that the church desires the assessment on this land returned to the tax roll in exchange for exemption on its new property—a lot purchased from Jennie M. Bertollette.

Town Clerk VanDorn called attention to mortgage amortization arrears due by the Hartdale Development Corporation and on motion of Councilman Charles J. Costabell it was decided to extend the mortgage for 90 days providing all current interest and taxes are paid within ten days. Councilman Warren D. Benedict offered the seconding.

A public hearing was held on the application of the Parkway Gardens Association for rezoning undeveloped land in that area and the council approved rezoning the lots immediately in the development from 0-3 to 0-30 increasing the minimum building plots from 5,000 to 7,500 square feet and rezoning the Hillsdale Avenue frontage in the development from roadhouse and stores to a 0-30—minimum building plots of 7,500 square feet for residential purposes only. The changes were not opposed and while the petitioners were present no one spoke.

Another public hearing took place on the application of the Wilson Holding Corporation to rezone its land on the east side of Central Avenue in Greenville from apartments-stores to business and this was approved although the change was opposed by the Greenville Community Council. It was pointed out that the land lies between Ardsley Road and Henry Street where numerous businesses exist.
