Ngghialo is useful to the Reds for one reason. It is the center of a small, isolated rice-growing area surrounded by mountains. The Red food supply, now very short, will be helped somewhat by taking these rice fields.

In all this, however, there is still no answer to the really big question: Are the Communists capable of launching a major offensive against the main French position in the delta during this Winter fighting season? Have the Chinese Reds been able to spare enough resources from Korea to build up their Viet-Minh allies to the offensive level?
