

LOUIS ZITO CRITICIZES HIGHWAYS

Believes in Stronger Procedures For All Safety Violators

Mayor Louis Zito of Ardsley speaking before a meeting of campaign workers Monday night at his headquarters sharply criticized what he termed "GOP foot-dragging" in the area of highway safety. Mayor Zito is the Democratic candidate for Assemblyman in the Second Assembly District.

Mayor Zito said, "The shocking statistics which county and state wide highway accidents are piling up lend support to the theory that the GOP feels not in the least bit concerned about vehicular mayhem. Foot dragging here in Westchester has prevented an emergency safety program from being adopted which would make the Cross County Parkway something other than the "murderer's row" that it is now. Disputes over who shall dispense patronage and of whom has permitted a major traffic artery 20 years outmoded to function in a deadly business as usual pattern."

Mayor Zito continued, "The legislature through its GOP ma-

iority killed that portion of Gov. Harriman's highway safety program which would have broadened the Motor Vehicle Commissioner's power to revoke or suspend driver's licenses.

"We spend untold millions to combat disease and save the lives of our youngsters. Then we allow them to kill themselves on our highway," Mayor Zito concluded with. "I believe in mandatory suspension of drivers' license under specified conditions after each speeding conviction. I believe in strengthening apprehension and conviction procedures in drunken driving charges. I think every law enforcement officer and every citizen should be educated to the fact that the so-called slightly drunk driver is in fact very much more dangerous than the stumbling drunk who warns all before him that he is incapable of control. I believe in a stop to highway safety unconcern."

GREENBURGH CENTER STARTS NEW BUILDING

Synagogue Sanctuary Expected To Be Up By Spring Of 1959

Construction began yesterday on the new building of the Greenburgh Hebrew Center, 515 Broadway, Dobbs Ferry. The new structure, to be completed in the Spring of 1959, will adjoin the present Center building.

It will contain the Synagogue sanctuary, an auditorium, Youth lounge, administrative offices and a kitchen. The new chapel and auditorium can be joined to seat up to one thousand people.

The Greenburgh Hebrew Center, will be affiliated with the United Synagogue of America, served the Jewish residents of Dobbs Ferry, Ardsley, Hastings, Irvington and surrounding areas. "The building program was necessitated by a steadily growing membership and the long-felt need for larger facilities," according to Jack Wehrub, Dobbs Ferry, president of the Center. Neal Vetrano Construction

Company was awarded the contract and Maurice Capabianco is the architect. Mortgage arrangements were worked out with the National Bank of Westchester.

The Greenburgh Hebrew Center acquired its present building and grounds in 1948. Jack Soukin, Hastings, is chairman of the Building Fund campaign and David Newman of Hastings headed the physical building committee.

In March of this year, Rabbi Mordecai I. Brill, formerly of Philadelphia, Pa., was called an spiritual leader of the congregation.
