A special Dedicatory Youth Service for the religious school classes and the Youth groups will take place on Sunday afternoon, September 13 at 1 P. M., to be followed by an Open House for friends and neighbors from 4 to 6 P. M.

The Greenburgh Hebrew Center was founded in 1946 to serve the villages of the Town of Greenburgh and moved to its present location in 1948. The new building, which adjoins the older structure, contains, in addition to the Sanctuary, an auditorium, kitchen Youth lounge and office space. The Center is affiliated with the United Synagogue of America, the national organization of Congregations following Conservative Judaism as distinct from Reform or Orthodox.
