Of All Faiths

Sacred Heart R.C. Church in Dobbs Ferry is about to celebrate its 125th anniversary. In 1862, Father David O'Connor was appointed first pastor of the Dobbs Ferry

district, which included Hastings and Abbotsford (now Irvington). Before that time, Dobbs Ferry had been an outmission of Tarrytown. A small church was built in 1866. and the parish was incorpora-

ted in 1886. The present building was dedicated on Feb. 16, 1896. Now, it is being restored with the help of a bequest from the late Thomas Oussani.

The lower hall, which will be renamed in honor of Mr. Oussani, is just about completed, and a campaign is in progress in order to take care of other needed work. Memorial gifts will be acknowledged on the 125th anniversary plaque.

Greenburgh Hebrew Center also in Dobbs Ferry, is running a capital rebuilding campaign to expand and improve facilities for the children and to upgrade the sanctuary and social halls. The campaign will last through the end of March 1987. The center was organized in 1946-47, and in 1949 the present building was bought and remodeled.

On All Saints Day, a procession of mini-saints, the children in the Christian Education Department, marched toward the altar of St. Barnabas Church in Ardsley. Costumed by their teachers and parents, they portrayed Mary, the mother of Jesus, and Joseph, his earthly father, a carpenter; Andrew and Simon Peter: James and John; St. Patrick, St. Francis of Assisi, Queen Esther, Joseph in his coat of many colors, Jonah and his whale, St. Elizabeth Seton, St. Katherine Tekawitha, Lilly of the Mohawks; and others including a great multitude in white robes.

Dr. John Watt, who has been organist and choir director in Grace Episcopal Church in Hastings since 1980, will assume the same positions at North Yonkers Community Church.

Nineteen Eighty Six marks the 30th anniversary of the establishment of the Legion of Mary unit at St. Matthew's R.C. parish beginning Dec. 7.

Its purpose is to enable lay men and women to assist people who are experiencing family, financial, physical, or spiritual difficulties.
