V.I.P. Instructors Sought

Registration is now open for a free course to train individuals to become V.I.P. (Volunteers in the Parks) instructors. 
Institute Seeks Volunteers

The Institute of Chronobiology at The New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center, Westchester Division in White Plains, seeks volunteers for a study of biological rhythms in major depression.

Volunteers, who will be paid, will live for 17 days in a time isolation laboratory at the institute. The time isolation unit is constructed as homelike environment. although there are no time cues such as daylight, clocks, TV and radio. The well-being of volunteers who qualify for the study will be closely monitored by a psychiatrist assigned to the unit and by the institute personnel who have frequent contact with the research subjects.

Candidates for the study should be 20-65 years old and should have been diagnosed as having recurrent, unipolar, primary, major depression. They must not be taking psychiatric medications.
