In those ten years we have seen our YINR community expand and flourish in our new surroundings, as our shul has become the preeminent Orthodox synagogue in all of Westchester County. In addition to our Shabbat minyanim, we have eight (!) daily minyanim, two daily daf yomis and many additional learning opportunities. We are the proud home of the Women's Institute of Jewish Studies (WIJS) and Ruach's weekly Wednesday programming. Hundreds of our children participate in our youth programming each week as well as in special youth events. His wisdom and guidance, as well as his dedication to YINR, are the engine to our continued physical and spiritual growth. Rabbi Chaim Axelrod in just his second year at YINR is already a force for communal growth and inspiration.

Dina and Marc Sterman have positively impacted every aspect of YINR daily life since they moved in over twenty years ago.
